1. S.A.M.Seminar Report

A report was tabled by Monty Tyrrell on the seminar activities and is contained at the end of the minutes.

David Reynolds suggested that for the following Seminar Days more input be put into the Seminar side of things by members being encouraged to display partly built models and rare motors etc.

NOTE. Chris Ellis may (as a result of the Seminar of 27/1/85) be eligible for the Guinness Book Of Records for being the first QUADRAPLEGIC to enter a Model Aircraft Competition in the World.

The S.A.M. Seminar will forthwith be known as the "S.R.(Roy) Robertson Memorial Trophy Day. The members present wish it to be known that this event will be a S.A.M.s Southern Region run event.

2. VENUES FOR O.T. EVENTS 1985/86.

Quite some discussion was involved about this item. Winston Crowther has been asked by the Laverton R.A.A.F. Base Aeromodellers Club for S.A.M.s members to just come down and fly at Laverton . This can be as often as every six(6) weeks.(not comp flying just for fun). The Sec. will write to the Base Comm. and ask for details. The O.T. Fly In held at the Laverton Base last November was very well received by the Aeromodellers there and therefore the Committee will be asking if this event can be run every year.

It was noted that the height restrictions placed on the modelling fraternity are a problem to our competitions thus the sec. will enueavour to find out from the D.O.T. if lifting these restrictions can take place for comps on certain nominated days.
