I'm trying to visualize this:

Silk Trimming Technique

You grasp the blade between your thumb and fore finger and then straddle the edge of the fuselage. Holding the fuselage in your left hand, you carefully press the blade on the silk and slide it in your right hand continuously down the length of the fuselage cutting the silk with an 1/8" overlap in a single stroke using your thumb and fore finger as a guide. You will be surprised how straight a cut you get. Then you brush Acetone on the excess side and gently lift and pull the excess silk away leaving a perfect straight 1/8" wide seam as shown below.

I received the above message from Thomas Ryan indicating that maybe he was having trouble visualizing my silk trimming description. So I did this pose below and had Sue take the picture and then I added the white lines and captions. In fact, I will go back and add this picture to my Report No. 87 and re-post it.
